December 2, 2010, Dubai, UAE: The social development organization Monyati Initiatives has partnered with innovative US-based real estate developer Delos Living to implement a USD \$400,000 commitment to the Clinton Global Initiative (CGI) to fund the construction of 200 affordable homes in Haiti designed to provide transitional housing for earthquake refugees. The effort will initiate a long term goal to shelter to thousands of Haitians who lost their homes and livelihood in this years' tragic earthquake.

"This commitment from Delos Living is critical and will make a real and tangible difference to our efforts to drive the CGI housing project forward in Haiti. Construction commenced in August, with a commitment to build 200 homes within the next four years," said Monja Wolf, Founder and Executive Director of Monyati Initiatives.
